Homebeats: Struggles for Racial Justice (CDROM) - A multimedia journey through time from the Caribbean, Asia and Africa to the making of modern Britain. **KS3/4/+ IRP £35.00**

Who Do We Think We Are? - Large-scale immigration has significantly changed British society. But while Trevor McDonald may be the nation's favourite newsreader and curry a national dish, the Stephen Lawrence case and harsh treatment of asylum seekers reveal the deep divisions and contradictions within our society. RACISM

Patterns of Racism - This book traces the different ways that racism and colonialism have developed in various parts of the world and how and why they took on particular forms. Bringing the story up to the 20th century, it covers North America, Australia and New Zealand, Southern Africa, Latin America, the West Indies and India. SLAVERY

The Changing Face of Slavery - Videopack containing two 15 minute films. The first one explores the Transatlantic Slave Trade and the issue of slavery today, while the second looks at children working in Britain at the time of the Industrial Revolution and explores child labour today. *KS3 Anti-Slavery Int'l £17.60*

Anthony Burns: The defeat and triumph of a fugitive slave - A story, by Virginia Hamilton, from 19th century Virginia about a slave called Anthony Burns who escapes, is imprisoned, and eventually becomes part of the abolitionist movement himself. *KS4 Dell Laurel Leaf £5.50*

The beat of a Drum: A Story of African Slavery - A moving and descriptive story by Stewart Ross of an African boy sold into slavery in 18th century America. *KS3 Hodder Wayland £4.99*

Chains: Juliet's father sells slaves - Novel for young people set in the 1790s. Juliet takes her brother's place on her father's ship to prove to him that she can make her way in his business as well as any boy. Her trip turns into a nightmare when she realises the ship is part of the slave trade. *KS3/4 OUP £6.99*
